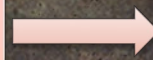

 - John 16:8
- **Enables one to hear**
 - Exod. 7:13

 - 2 Samuel 24:10
- **Enables one to repent and be forgiven**
 - 2 Cor. 7:10; Acts 2:37, 38; 1 John 1:9

Self-condemnation After Reconciliation?

failure after receiving forgiveness*
